Reports from the Chief -

Chief Mercer – We had 28 calls in February. 17 Fire, 11 EMS, and 0 HazMat. Rookie academy is about half way through Fire 1. ESO is ongoing, working on Property then will move to checklists. Have done some station tours and a couple of fire inspections. We attended the debrief in Hayden for the fatal on Highway 40. Fleet: the tank crack on E2 is scheduled for repair around May. E3 looking into a loose wire in the headlight switch, E5 parts are in, waiting on install. L1 windshield is on order. Door locks at the station are all replaced. Lobby lights are mostly done. Roof over the wildland bays; the adjuster had us shore, engineers and building inspector are meeting here tomorrow at 1:00. Have for safety moved trucks, if ok, will readjust trucks until fixed. We have been able to run percentage reports with ESO. We will be having meetings regarding participation moving forward. June 3rd is the Luau at the OP. Trying earlier dates to try to boost attendance.

Asst Chief Hampton – Spring is about here. The City ordered 2,000 sandbags. We should probably order about 1,000 in case of flooding. Approximate cost of \$375.00. Looking to help out just in case of flooding. Forgay – if no objections, go ahead and order.
